### WINTER DRIVING TIPS

- 1. Inspect Your Vehicle: Check the tire pressure, engine oil and antifreeze levels before you hit the road.
- 2. **Slow Down**: You may need to compensate for poor road traction by reducing your speed. It also gives you more reaction time.
- 3. Give Yourself Extra Space: Leave extra room between the vehicle in front of you so you can move out of harms way, if needed.
- 4. Stay Smooth: Refrain from sudden braking, acceleration, cornering, etc.; Pump your brakes & maintain a consistent speed.
- 5. Pay Attention to the Tire Spray: Observe the water coming off the tires of nearby vehicles; less spray = possibility of freezing
- 6. Let There Be Light: Keep your trailer lights bright and clean for improved visibility
- 7. Take Evasive Action: Consider decelerating your truck slightly and maneuvering around obstacles instead of hard braking
- 8. When in Doubt, Pull Over: If the weather condition is too severe, get off the roadway and wait until the weather gets better
- 9. Be Prepared: Travel with warm clothes, road flares, a flashlight, a shovel, etc. in case you run into trouble on the road
- 10. **Check Twice**: Traffic lights and signs can be difficult to see in a blizzard. Make sure to look twice before proceeding through an intersection or making a turn.
