Brake Safety Week: August 22-28

Brake Safety Week is part of the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance's Operation Airbrake initiative – an enforcement campaign that aims to reduce the number of highway crashes caused by faulty brake systems on commercial motor vehicles. Local, state and federal safety officials will be checking for:

- Loose or missing parts
- Air or hydraulic fluid leaks
- Trouble-indicator lights on the dash, including antilock brakes
- Worn linings, pads, drums or rotors
- Mismatched air chamber sizes across axles
- Proper brake adjustment
- Brake hoses and tubing condition (a special focus for this year's inspections)

Help Prevent Violations! Please make sure you are checking the following *everyday* when you conduct your pre-trip inspection:

- Check for damaged or loose-hanging air chambers, pushrods or slack adjusters.
- Make sure slack adjusters on each axle are extended out to the same angle.
 Different angles can indicate an out-of-adjustment brake or a broken spring brake power spring.
- Examine tubing and hose condition, positioning and connections.
- Every week, you should perform a 90 to 100 psi brake application with the wheels chocked and the parking brakes released to listen for leaks. The air disc brake rotors and brake drum linings should also be checked for wear/cracks.

Industry Updates: Thruway Rest Areas

The 27 New York State Thruway rest areas are currently being renovated/rebuilt as part of a \$450 million investment plan. The project will be completed in two phases:

- Phase 1: July 2021 November 2023
 Service Areas: Indian Castle, Junius Ponds, Chittenango, Ardsley, Iroquois, Clarence, Plattekill, Clifton Springs, New Baltimore, Pembroke, Seneca, Oneida, Pattersonville, Sloatsburg, Scottsville, Ulster
- Phase 2: January 2023 May 2025
 Service Areas: Schuyler, Ontario, Malden, Guilderland, Port Byron, Warners, Ramapo, Angola, Dewitt, Mohawk, Modena

Fuel service and commercial parking will be available at *all* service areas during construction (with the exception of the Ardsley location, which is open for fuel only). Port-a-johns have been placed at rest area locations that have been closed for renovations.
